

WHAT IS SALUD Y PAZ?

Salud y Paz promotes integrated health, healing, and education with Mayan communities in Guatemala by enabling access to health care and early childhood education.

WHAT DO SERVICE TEAMS DO?

Rural Medical Teams provide an opportunity for Guatemalan people living in rural villages to receive medical care they wouldn't be able to afford or access otherwise. Families can see a doctor, receive medication, and if necessary, be referred to one of our clinics for ongoing care. Teams consist of providers (doctors, nurse practitioners, or physician assistants), nurses, and other medical or non-medical personnel. Teams stay in Chichicastenango and serve the villages in the area of Chichicastenango and Nahuala. All supplies and medications are packed in suitcases and are brought with the team each day. Teams set up a triage station, doctors' offices, pharmacy, and follow-up education stations in schools, community buildings, or churches in local communities. Each general medicine provider sees approximately 30 patients per day.

Rural Dental Teams serve together with Rural Medical Teams or as standalone teams. Providing dental care in the rural villages gives people an affordable opportunity to receive essential, quality dental procedures. Without dental teams, rotting teeth and cavities often go untreated and can become dangerous. Teams consist of dentists, assistants, and other dental or non-dental personnel. Similar to our Rural Medical Teams, dental teams stay in Chichicastenango and serve the villages in the area of Chichicastenango and Nahuala. Corrugated plastic dental chairs are provided by Salud y Paz and assembled by the team at each site. All supplies and medications are packed in suitcases and are brought with the team each day. Due to the context in which we work, Salud y Paz Rural Dental Teams perform extractions and refer to our central clinic for restorative procedures. Dentists serving on Rural Dental Teams typically see a range of 15-20 patients per day.

Construction/Maintenance Teams are the heart of our presence in the Mayan Highlands and have been instrumental in building the foundation of our presence here. Beginning 2025, our construction teams will be helping us build our most ambitious project yet: our Regional Health Center. Volunteer teams will work alongside our Guatemalan engineering team to bring this vision to life. Your hands-on work—whether you're laying cinder blocks, mixing concrete, or doing carpentry—will directly create a space that will serve thousands of people.

HOW DO I SCHEDULE A TRIP DATE?

The first step to schedule your mission week is to email us with a possible date. If your date is open, you can secure that date and be put on the schedule after your deposit (\$250) has been sent to Salud y Paz.

WHAT DOES IT COST?

\$1,100 per person

Teams with more than 14 members will be offered a discount of \$50 per person

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Construction/Maintenance Team Donation: Construction teams are charged an additional one-time fee of \$2,700 to cover costs for construction and maintenance materials, foreman and labor for a week-long project.

WHAT MEDICATIONS & SUPPLIES DO I NEED TO BRING?

We encourage all rural medical teams to purchase a Med Box from Salud y Paz. All purchasing, packing and preparation is handled by the Salud y Paz Guatemala staff for the team, ready for your arrival. A full med box costs \$4,250 and a half med box costs \$2,125. We generally recommend one full med box to every two-three providers.

Teams can also purchase a box of dental medicines and supplies for \$300, which is sufficient for one dental provider for the week. The cost of one dental box is \$300.

WHAT WILL THE ITINERARY BE?



Saturday	Arrival in Guatemala. Most teams will arrive at the work week hotel during the evening. Time for check in and dinner.
Sunday	Free day and orientation. Salud y Paz Coordinator will meet with the team during breakfast time to provide general recommendations. Many teams will enjoy a visit to the famous Chichicastenango market, cemetery, or a local church in addition to some time to relax and prepare for the work week. Salud y Paz staff will meet with the team again after dinner on Sunday to provide general orientation for the work week.
Monday	Work day 1: At the end of the day the team have a review meeting of the work day.
Tuesday-Thursday	Work days 2-4: If time permits during the week, Salud y Paz staff will take the team on a visit to a local family's home. At the end of each day the team will meet to discuss the highlights of the day.
Friday	Team will check out of work week hotel and visit the Salud y Paz main project site in Camanchaj on their way to their free day location. Check in to weekend hotel.
Saturday	Team will enjoy free time in Panajachel or Antigua
Sunday	Departure to the United States
